TECUMSEH — Kenneth L. "Bill" Armstrong, 56, died unexpectedly Wednesday at his residence, 6744 Gove Court.

He was born in Bolar, Va., July 27, 1924 to William and Alma Long Armstrong. He married Betty Jean Adams on May 11, 1945 in Detroit.

Mr. Armstrong was a veteran of World War II. He served in the U.S. Navy, making 13 trips overseas during World War II and received the European-African-Middle East ribbon and star.

He lived in Detroit until 1968 when he moved to Tecumseh, and for the last 10 years was a truck driver for U.S. Truck Co. of Detroit. He was a member of the United Methodist Church of Tecumseh and the Way-O-Mac's Chapter of National Campers and Hikers Assn., and was a former scoutmaster.
